# **God Is Our Loving Father**

Humanity tends to project its own faulty habits onto God. This is especially true regarding the nature of His love. We think we must barter, plead, or try hard to earn the Lord's favor. But as the prodigal son learned, the Father's love <u>IS</u> unconditional.



The wayward son expected his father's love to be diminished. Therefore, he went home hoping for a place among the family

servants. Imagine the boy's delight when Dad greeted him with a hug and a celebration. His actions certainly didn't merit an outpouring of affection, but Jesus' parable is all about a Father who doesn't give people what they deserve.

A love based on conduct would keep people guessing, *Have I done enough?* Instead, God cares for you simply because you're you, and He expects *nothing* in return. Consider the prodigal's life after his homecoming party. He didn't move into the servants' quarters and get to work. He was reinstated to his place as the second son of a wealthy man, with all of the privilege that entails. In the same way, believers are the Lord's cherished children (2 Cor. 6:18). When God looks at His loved ones, He doesn't focus upon past failures, faults, or sin. He sees the heirs to His kingdom—men and women who love Him and desire to spend eternity in His presence.

No matter how far we may wander from the Lord's perfect will for our lives, we are always welcome back. The Bible teaches that God's love cannot be lost, regardless of sin or poor decisions (though we may have to live with the consequences). **Our Father's arms are always open and His unconditional love will always be there.** - TC

In many Christian churches, Pentecost Sunday is celebrated to recognize the gift of the Holy Spirit, realizing that God's very life, breath and energy lives in believers. The celebration of Pentecost Sunday reminds us of the reality that we all have the unifying Spirit that was poured out upon the first century church in Acts 2:1-4. It is a reminder that we are co-heirs with Christ, to suffer with Him that we may also be glorified with Him; that the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good (1 Cor. 12:7); that we are all baptized by one Spirit into one body (1 Cor. 12:13); and that the Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead lives inside believers (Romans 8:9-11). This gift of the Holy Spirit that was promised and given to all believers on the first Pentecost is promised for you and your children and for all who are far off whom the Lord our God will call (Acts 2:39). 
We are in need of volunteers to help serve

# Notes From Tim

Beginning when I was just a little boy I remember so well our family watching the Billy Graham Crusades on TV. I am quite sure you remember them too. I loved listening to those big mass volunteer choirs directed by Cliff Barrows, with John Innes playing the organ. I especially was "glued" to the TV when George Beverly Shea would sing the song "I'd Rather Have Jesus."

The inspiring and challenging words of this hymn, written by Mrs. Rhea Miller, so influenced 23 year-old George Beverly Shea that they determined the direction of his life. As he began to compose a melody for these moving lines, he decided to devote his singing talent to God's glory alone. Born in 1909, and growing up with devoted Christian parents, Bev was encouraged to use his fine singing voice often in the services of the Wesleyan Methodist churches of which his father was a minister. He soon began to sing in other churches and on Christian radio programs.

One Sunday as Bev went to the family piano, he came across the song "I'd Rather Have Jesus" and decided to sing it in church that morning. Bev Shea comments: "Over the years, I've not sung any song more than 'I'd Rather Have Jesus,' but I never tire of Mrs. Miller's heartfelt words," As a young man of 23, Bev allowed the message of this text to guide him wisely to a wonderfully productive life of service to Christ as he shared his musical "theme song" after joining with the Billy Graham Crusade in 1947 and to other audiences around the world.

I'd rather have Jesus than silver or gold

I'd rather be His than have riches untold I'd rather have Jesus than houses or land I'd rather be led by His nail-pierced hand: I'd rather have Jesus than worldly applause I'd rather be faithful to His dear cause I'd rather have Jesus than worldwide fame Yes, I'd rather be true to His holy name He's fairer than lilies of rarest bloom; *He's sweeter than honey from out the comb;* He's all that my hungering spirit needs; I'd rather have Jesus and let Him lead. Than to be the king of a vast domain And be held in sin's dread sway I'd rather have Jesus than anything This world affords today.

George Beverly Shea retired in Montreat, NC where he lived until his death on April 16, 2013 at age 104. He was buried at Billy Graham Library grounds in Charlotte, NC.
